SPECIFIC INFORMATION ABOUT THE COURSE

I. Contents description:

I.I In English:

This course is intended to introduce and familiarize students with the conceptual delimitation of the commercial legal framework and then analyze the legislation that controls or delimits the concept and the activity of business persons in economic transactions.

Contents: Introduction to Commercial law and scope of application. Regulatory peculiarities and new trends. The company and the entrepreneur, legal status of the entrepreneur. Exercise of commercial activity by an individual entrepreneur. Rules applicable to competition and their application. Regime applicable to industrial property and its application. The exercise of commercial activity by a legal entity: general company theory, company system, structure and operation of the various types of companies, structure and functioning of the various types of companies securities law Peculiarities of commercial contracts. Solutions to financial crises: Insolvency law.

1.2 In Spanish:

Este curso pretende introducir y familiarizar a los alumnos en el marco legal en el que se desarrolla el Derecho de la empresa en España. Para ello se analiza la legislación que controla o delimita la actividad de los empresarios en las transacciones mercantiles.

Contenidos: Introducción al Derecho mercantil y ámbito de aplicación. Peculiaridades normativas y nuevas tendencias. La empresa y el empresario, estatuto jurídico

del empresario. Ejercicio de actividad mercantil por empresario individual. Régimen aplicable a la competencia y su aplicación. Régimen aplicable a la propiedad industrial y su aplicación. Ejercicio de actividad mercantil por persona jurídica: teoría general de las sociedades, sistema de sociedades, estructura y funcionamiento de los diversos tipos sociales. Derecho de los títulos valores. Peculiaridades de la contratación mercantil. Tipos contractuales mercantiles. Solución a las crisis financieras: el Derecho concursal.

2. Background:

2. I Situation within the Degree:

First year, second semester.

2.2 Recommendations

Since this course is offered to students of whatever degree, no prerequisite is required, although a general knowledge of Law is recommended.

3. Objectives (as result of teaching):

- Show a deep understanding of basic Commercial law principles and institutions, both at the national and at the transnational (European, international) level.
- Interpret legal norms showing an adequate knowledge of the specialities of legal Interpretation in Commercial law as well as its relevance.
- Interpret and handle non-binding legal norms (soft law)
- Select correctly the norm to be applied, according to locus and time rules of application, in order to solve Commercial law issue. Perform oral presentations with command of presentation techniques

5.2 Teaching Methods::

Lectures will have a major weight at the start of the term. Even there has traditionally been a lack of basic resources in English to assist in the preparation in the teaching of mercantile subject, there is currently a handbook that we will use as a reference text.

5.3 Development and Justification:

Active participation in readings' discussion on theoretical topics will be scheduled every week to be discussed in class time. Students are expected to read them in advance and take part in discussions in class room on questions previously posed by the teacher. Assessment will focus on students abilities to analyse and interpret legal texts and to think critically.
